Latin Forenames and their English Equivalents

Roman Catholic registers are generally written in Latin. This causes few problems since the vocabulary is fairly limited, but the Latinisation of modern names may cause some confusion. Latin nouns, including proper names, are declined, the word ending signifying the role of the person in the sentence. Two forms will be encountered in a baptism entry depending on whether the person was the subject of the sentence (nominative) or the parent (genitive). For example Albertus filius Albertum SMITH shows different endings applied to Albert the son (-us) and Albert the father (-um).

A further difficulty is the use, on some occasions, of fully Latinised names such as Guilelmus (William) and the possibility that two or more modern forenames may derive from a single Latin origin (for example Jacobus may be translated as either James or Jacob) so one may not always be certain as to which name the person used in everyday life.

There are also some letter substitutions which may confuse. The letter "J" may be rendered as "I" for example "loannis" may be read as "Joannis". "V" and "U" may be interchanged for example "Hvmfridus". "X" may be used as an abbreviation for "Chris(t)" as in "Xopherus". Abbreviations are also used at times to save time or space. "Johes" appearing in place of "Johannes".

A final problem is the sometimes limited knowledge of Latin by the priest recording the event. This may manifest itself in the use of an incorrect Latin equivalent or in an inappropriate word ending. For modern names, a variety of endings may be encountered depending on the whim of the individual priest. These difficulties are, of course, additional to the usual problems of eccentricities of spelling. Often an "appropriate" suffix will simply be added to the end of the English name.

The table below sets out some common and less common forenames with English equivalents. This information is for guidance only. Researchers are encouraged to refer to the original registers in cases where there is any uncertainty that the interpretation is incorrect and to consult surname dictionaries which may provide additional information.
